Post Treatment Instructions

Root Canal (Endodontic Therapy)

A root canal is needed when decay (cavity) has invaded or damaged the "live" part of the tooth or the nerve. You may or <u>may not</u> have an active infection.

Root Canal Therapy can sometimes be sensitive to bite on for the next 24-48 hours-<u>this is normal</u>. You can take over-the-counter antiinflammatory medication (like Advil or Motrin) or you may be given prescription medication by the Doctor.

Finally, root canal teeth become very brittle over time and have a high risk of breaking. A full covering (crown or cap) is needed along with a strengthening post & core procedure to help you keep your tooth useful.

It is very important to keep all of your treatment appointments to make sure you have a successful root canal therapy result.
